# Interpreting Shakespearean Text - A Midsummer Night's Dream

Four Person Dialogue: Helena and Hermia

Each character is played by two actors. The first speaks the lines as written; the second 'translates' the line to clarify the meaning.

### HERMIA

I frown upon him, yet he loves me still.

### **HELENA**

O that your frowns would teach my smiles such skill!

### **HERMIA**

I give him curses, yet he gives me love.

### HELENA

O that my prayers could such affection move!

### **HERMIA**

The more I hate, the more he follows me.

### HELENA

The more I love, the more he hateth me.

### **HERMIA**

His folly, Helena, is no fault of mine.

## **HELENA**

None, but your beauty: would that fault were mine!
